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Candlelight Ski – January 25, 2008

The annual popular winter event, the Candlelight Ski, will be held on January 25, 2008 from 6 – 9 P.M. The Red Cedar Trail and the Stokke Trail will be lit with luminaries. With the snow that we have had this season, it shapes up to be a great night for cross- country skiing on The Red Cedar State Trail. It will be open from the Depot to the ice wall, about 1.5 miles. We ask walkers to be respectful of the groomed Red Cedar State Trail and refrain from walking on it. The Stokke Trail will be cleared to provide the opportunity for those wishing to take a candlelight walk. For those wishing to ski, it is advisable that you bring your own skis. Limited ski rentals will be available from Stout Adventures by calling, 232-5190, in advance.

The Depot will be open and staffed with volunteers who can provide information about the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills. Of interest are the many displays in the Depot. Passes will not be required that evening; however, yearly trail passes will be available for sale. Also, for sale, will be Red Cedar State Trail merchandise.

After skiing or walking, warm up with a cup of hot chocolate provided by Swiss Miss and join everyone around the glowing bonfire. It is a fun time for the whole family to experience the joys of winter.

This event is organized by the Friends of the Red Cedar State Trail & Hoffman Hills, Swiss Miss and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

AD HOC BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN PATHWAY PLANNING COMMITTEE

As was reported in the last version of the newsletter, Dunn County has formed an Ad Hoc committee to develop guidelines for a bicycle/pedestrian friendly transportation system. The make-up of the committee is a very diverse group of interested citizens and local, county and city officials. The idea is to develop a county-wide system of bike/pedestrian corridors that encourage and promote bicycling/walking both from the recreational aspect as well as a means of commuting. At this time, the objectives of the committee are in the process of being developed. In addition, a focus group composed of both road and trail bikers have been formed to identify various bike routes in Dunn County. It is anticipated the routes will include information on points of interest, roads that are safe and accessible and routes that connect with other towns in Dunn County. In addition, a tourism focus group will be formed. It is expected a member of the bike route focus group will be part of the tourism focus group to further meet the goals of the comprehensive plan. The Ad Hoc committee and associated focus groups will consider a number of items including safety, compatibility with the state trail system, coordination with adjacent counties' systems, compatibility with roadways, routing to county attractions and routes which serve the needs of potential users. This is a first step in the creation of a comprehensive plan for the county. Members of the Friends Group are participants in this committee.

ABOUT "FRIENDS OF THE RED CEDAR STATE TRAIL AND HOFFMAN HILLS"

The Friends of the Red Cedar State Trail & Hoffman Hills is a non-profit corporation organized for the charitable and educational purpose of supporting, assisting, and promoting the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources with interpretive, scientific, historical, educational, and related visitor services at the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills, Dunn County, Wisconsin. In order to accomplish this purpose, the corporation has the following objectives:

- A) Sponsor and support volunteer interpretive services and environmental education activities, seminars, lectures and other activities that contribute to the interpretive and educational programs of the trail.
- B) Provide for the distribution or sale of appropriate interpretive materials, such as books, pamphlets, and photography at the trail.
- C) Provide financial support to the trail for the furtherance of its interpretive programs, facilities, and resources, raising revenues through such methods as membership fees, donations, sales and special events.
- D) Advocate for policies to preserve and maintain the RCST and HH as natural wildlife areas.

In the support of the objectives listed above, the Friends Group played major roles in the organization of three activities: the annual Candlelight Ski/Hike, National Trails Day and the Annual Meeting bringing a noted speaker.

A number of work projects were undertaken: volunteers gave the inside of the depot a badly needed new coat of paint; a dedicated group of individuals gave graciously of their time each week in order to staff the center; eradicating invasive species; woody invasives were cut from the depot prairie, and mullein was pulled from the one at Hoffman Hills; improvements were made to some exhibits at the Visitor Center; establishment of a website for the Friends of the Red Cedar Trail and Hoffman Hills has begun.

A major addition to the educational component this year were the activities led by Dennis Wiebel (below) which included a number of interpretive walks along the trail and a biweekly column in the Dunn County News, called the Red Cedar Notebook, which featured species found along the trail.

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Our cash balance decreased in 2007 by \$4,375.68 with major expenses going to funding the Volunteer Coordinator position for \$3,500.00, helping the Durand Trail with their upgrade work for \$1,500.00 and "T" shirts cost \$1,261.34. We also helped with the cost of painting the interior of the Depot for \$350.00 and split signing costs with the Friends of the Chippewa River Trail for \$564.50. Our major sources of revenue were: \$2,069.35 for trail passes sold, \$1,651.20 for "T" shirts sold and \$1,430.00 for memberships. The closing 12/31/07 balance was \$9,242.51. In addition, there is a balance of \$1,850.00 in the FRCST & HH Ski Grooming fund.

DUES REMINDER

The Friends of the Red Cedar State Trail & Hoffman Hills is a non-profit support organization dedicated to enhancing the recreational and educational opportunities by sponsoring, promoting and funding many activities as well as participating in projects that help to maintain and improve the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills. The Friends group derives its funding from dues paid by individuals and businesses, donations, grants, and a percentage of trail pass revenues. These funds provide resources for interpretive programs, volunteer workdays and community events such as the Annual Candlelight Ski. CROSS COUNTRY SKI CORNER

What a wonderful ski season it has been in December 2007 and continuing into 2008! Ron Pfiffner, Bruce Jordan, Dan Haug and Evan Jordan have been doing a great job grooming the Red Cedar State Trail. Grooming conditions at Hoffman Hills have been outstanding thanks to Jim Janowak and Bob Gores. Many, many, many skiers have been out enjoying the ski trails.

Progress is being made in reducing the damage caused by hikers/walkers. Some skiers will soon be sporting volunteer bibs. These bibs indicate the skier is a volunteer on the Red Cedar State Trail or at Hoffman Hills and will further redirect walkers/hikers to the designated walking trails. New signs were also put up on both ski trails, identifying the two places as designated ski trails. Due to Mother Nature's generosity this year, grooming has occurred more frequently. SILICA SAND MINE

On November 26, 2007, the Board of Adjustment heard testimony from opponents and supporters of Proppant's application to develop a strip mine on land next to Hoffman Hills. Many people from different organizations and connections with Hoffman Hills presented testimony to the Board of Adjustment. Over five hours of testimony was given. An unofficial tally indicated an overwhelming majority (7:1) were opposed to the strip mine. After a long night of taking testimony, the hearing was closed. A time for Proppant to present rebuttal information and for the Board of Adjustment to ask questions of Proppant was scheduled for December 19, 2007. After another long meeting on 12/19/07, the Board of Adjustment unanimously voted not to grant Proppant an exemption to mine near Hoffman Hills. Both the Tainter Township and the Red Cedar Township had denied Proppant's application and Proppant then appealed to the Board of Adjustment. Proppant has one more avenue to seek relief of the Board of Adjustment's decision. As of January 1, 2008, Proppant has not indicated if they plan to seek an appeal. The Board of the Friends of the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills presented testimony to the Board of Adjustment opposing Proppant's application to strip mine next to Hoffman Hills. The "Save Our Hills" organization gave an outstanding presentation at the 12/19/07 BOA meeting. Their work, dedication, organization and effort were effective and persuasive. Thank you to each and every member who was a part of this presentation.
