

Trail Manager's Report

Hi Folks, and welcome to another wonderful Fall in Wisconsin! Fall colors were fantastic, while they lasted... which was about a week. Just like the Spring wildflowers, enjoy them while you can! Things certainly do change fast, and it feels like Summer just blew by. It was a busy summer and we did get quite a few projects done.

This Summer started out stormy just like how this Fall is starting. We spent most of June and July clearing downed trees and cleaning up landslides. The Summer has been so hectic that we just recently had a chance to fix washouts at Hoffman Hills that occurred this Spring. Also, this Fall we built a new handicap accessible trail to the drinking fountain at Hoffman Hills. We also had a culvert replaced on the Red Cedar Trail that went bad this Spring near mile 2. Slowly but surely, we're making repairs to the properties.

There were a few setbacks with some of our projects we had planned on this year. The timber sale for the pine thinning at Hoffman Hills did not sell this Spring and will be rebid this Fall. There was also some habitat work planned around the prairie at Hoffman but that got postponed due to the wet weather. We are hoping to clear out some of that brush that's invading the prairie and open it back up in the future. This will be complimentary to the oak savanna work that we've done in the past. We are working with the Menomonie School District to do a prairie seeding this Fall or early Winter to plant around the oak savanna remnant area near the maintenance shop. We are continuing to plan for the equipment access trail to the observation tower and to work on the ridge top trails. Some of the enhancement grant components did get completed such as the entrance sign at the Red Cedar Trail but the orientation signs and kiosks will not be completed till early 2020.

As with the end of one season, another season starts. Now that biking season is over I want to thank all our summer volunteers that helped at the depot or worked on the trails. We certainly couldn't do it all without you. Now, we are looking forward to ski season and working with our volunteer groomers. This year will a bit different. I recently accepted a park manager position working mainly out of Lake Wissota State Park starting on November 11. I'll certainly miss the trails and working with our great volunteers and the Friends Group. I'm sure I'll still help occasionally when there's storm damage to cleanup and as needed but I'll be focusing on transitioning to that position this Winter. I want to thank you all for the support I have received while working here and am confident these properties will remain a treasure for the community to enjoy in the future.

Park staff are working on a transition plan to cover issues on the Trails and at Hoffman. Until November 11, I can still be reached at the main trail park office number of 715-232-1242.

I would like to thank all of the volunteers who worked at the Depot providing trail visitors the insight and direction that allows them to feel welcome and comfortable while using the trail. Based on the license plates in the parking lot I know we had visitors from throughout the country enjoying our trails and this is a true reflection of the wonderful job that you do. Thank you also to everyone who volunteers at Hoffman Hills as the efforts put in to maintain and improve the habitat are critical for us to continue to allow users to enjoy this wonderful property. National Trails Day went very well as the reptile exhibit, fishing and the other activities were once again all a big hit. Check out the pictures on our website as based on the smiles on the kid's faces it kind of tells it all as far as to the success of that day.

It was exciting for us to get the water dispensers installed in the Depot and in Downsville and based on the number of people who filled water bottles both were welcomed. We thank Conagra for the wonderful donation. You will also see new signage at both properties, and this is thanks to a DNR grant with matching funds provided by the Hoffman Foundation account within the Community Foundation of Dunn County and the FRCST. I also want to thank the businesses who have provided us with donations and memberships – our giving tree is very impressive thanks to your generous gifts.

The main purpose of the newsletter is to invite you to the annual meeting on November 11th. Julia Chapman, our speaker, is a member of the Biology Department at UW-Stout and has a research interest in old growth forest ecology. Please come out to the Raw Deal and enjoy the evening with us.

Summer highlights / year-to-date totals:

- Gross revenue from trail pass sales was \$4,860. Of this total, 80% was submitted to the DNR and \$972 (20%) stayed with the Friends of the Red Cedar Trail/Hoffman Hills.
- Merchandise sales at the Depot totaled \$906.05.
- Combined income for pass and merchandise sales was up 24% from last summer.
- Individual and business memberships are at \$2545.
- Donations stand at \$320.
- We received a grant from Friends of Wisconsin State Trails for \$125.
- The Conagra Brands Grant account was closed after applying the entire \$5000 balance toward the purchase of the drinking/water bottle stations at Downsville and the Depot.
