## Trail Manager's Report

Hello Friends,

It's been a rollercoaster of a spring so far. First it didn't seem like winter was willing to leave, then we hit 90° temps, then the spring storms began. Thankfully, we didn't have much flood damage and only a few minor landslides near mile 1 and 3. Of course it has been an active spring weather season with plenty of storms. There was a tornado that went just south of Hoffman Hills that blew down about a dozen large trees along the trails. Maintenance staff have spent a few days clearing trees between all the properties now. Now that the storm damage has been cleaned up, we're now trying to catch back up on the normal maintenance work including mowing/trimming, tread repairs, bridge repairs, etc...Good news is all the facilities are back open this year including the Depot Visitor Center with help from our many volunteers.

Our volunteers have been out in full force already helping with spring cleanup and maintenance work. There were two groups of Menomonie school students at Hoffman this spring. The middle school helped to clear trails and pick up garbage for Earth Day. We had the high school helping with the oak savanna project by repairing, replacing, and removing tree shelters. I really must thank the Optimist Club and in particular Dennis Spader for lining up the bus transport and providing food to the students for the high school workday. There were many other volunteers helping those days as well and I appreciate all of the folks that have helped out. I also want to thank the folks from Andersen Logistics, which is one our Adopt A Trail groups, that spent a day pulling garlic mustard from Irvington to Downsville. It's been a great community effort to get these properties ready for the summer season. Thanks so much to all of you and here's to another great summer season! Enjoy the trails.

As I write this the sun is out, it is almost 70 degrees, and the birds are singing loudly – spring has finally arrived. I hope with this change in the weather you can get out and enjoy our two wonderful properties along with all the other great outdoor opportunities we have in our community. I want to thank all of you for your continued support of the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills Recreation Area while updating you on some of the things that have happened since our last correspondence in January.

We had a successful ski season that included the return of our annual Candlelight Ski after a year's interruption due to covid. The weather cooperated, if you are a winter outdoor enthusiast, with temperatures in the low teens and light winds. Volunteers greeted over 400 visitors to the trail that evening who enjoyed skiing, snowshoes and walking on the candlelit trails, ending their night with a cup of hot chocolate provided by Conagra. Thanks go to all who help make this event a success.

Last fall we took on a project that we had not previously embarked on quite to this level and that was raising money for a new snowmobile to groom the Red Cedar. The support we received from Chippewa Valley skiers was incredible and due to that support along with the memberships from our local businesses and a few grants we raised the necessary funds to purchase a new Ski Doo Expedition snowmobile that should arrive in time for the 2022-2023 season. I will let you look at the pictures below to determine whether you can pick out the new versus the old. To say the groomers are excited is an understatement and we thank you again for your tremendous support.





Getting back a bit to what we once considered normal, we will be holding our annual National Trails Day event from 10:00 to noon on Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup> so hopefully you can attend as it is meant to be very child friendly. As will be noted in other spots in the newsletter, the Depot will be staffed throughout the summer to help visitors enjoy the trail and get information on our community.

## Treasurer's Report

It's been a busy year for the Friends of Red Cedar books! The most exciting news involves meeting the goal for the purchase of a new snowmobile to be delivered later this year. Thanks to many generous donations from individuals and businesses alike, our Grooming Equipment Account balance stands at \$16,539, which just covers the cost of the snowmobile we have on order:

NextGen Powersports invoice: \$17,026 Downpayment made: - \$500

Balance due: \$16,526

In addition to contributions toward snowmobile purchase, we're off to a good start with general memberships. Individual memberships to date total \$320 (up 27% from this time last year) and business memberships so far total \$1,750.

Trail pass sales are down slightly this year, although the late spring may have kept folks off the trails longer than usual. We've taken in \$1,325 so far between online sales and purchases made at the Chamber of Commerce office. Although 80% of that amount is submitted to the DNR, the remainder (\$265) goes directly to our organization -- a reminder of the value of buying your passes through the Friends of Red Cedar!
