We are looking forward to the Candlelight Ski on January 27th where you can see the new machine and we hope you will be able to join us that night as it is always a fun time.

Treasurer's Report

Activity finally started to return to normal for the Friends of the Red Cedar Trail in 2022, resulting in a nice bump in our finances. Individual membership donations nearly doubled to \$538 and it was nice to see some new members joining our cause. Business memberships continued strong even after our fundraising goal for the snowmobile was met, generating \$2547 in revenue. Membership contributions are our main source of income, so please keep that support coming!

Trail pass sales rebounded nicely this past year, both at the Depot and via online purchases. Our revenue from pass sales went from \$555 in 2021 to \$1,065 in 2022. The past year also saw some generous donations, including the \$250 Ashley Evenson Memorial for the Red Cedar Trail and \$2,000 from Fred and Ellen Ochs for future Friends of Red Cedar Trail & Hoffman Hills projects. We certainly appreciate your thoughtful support!
