Trail Manager's Report

Hello Friends,

Whew, what a spring we've had so far! It felt like old man winter just wouldn't let go and then suddenly it was summer. Finally, it's starting to feel a little more like a normal spring in May. Spring has been very busy with new folks coming on board, staff repairing flood damage and opening trail facilities.

We have one new person that was hired in April. Please welcome Michelle Bem who will be working part time at the Depot doing visitor services and working maintenance during the week. There was some spring flood damage by Dunnville Road near mile 12-13. About 200 feet of trail was washed out including Dunnville Road. The trail and road have been repaired with a little more finish grading to complete. We had to haul about 12 dump truck loads of limestone screenings to repair the trail washouts. Besides the flood damage there was also a culvert just south of Menomonie that caved in this spring and thankfully the Dunn County Highway Department helped us out to replace it. The trail was also graded and packed after the damaged portions were repaired. Another spring project that was completed was getting the Downsville rest area and the drinking fountain at Hoffman Hills opened for the year.

Now that we have our maintenance staff on for the summer and most of the spring cleanup work done, we'll be working on a list of things to catch up on for the summer season. We still have a little grading work to complete especially at the area we repaired by Dunnville Road. We have some signage to replace along the trails, bridges to repair, cleanup from the winter storms, and some picnic tables to repair and paint. Some of this work will get mixed in between our normal mowing and trimming routine throughout the summer, which we still have to catch up on.

We may have a couple development projects starting this year on top of our routine maintenance work. The stream crossing near mile 1 ½ is in the process for replacement. That crossing has been damaged many times over the years due to flash flooding events. A new design will hopefully alleviate the issues with the flash flooding that is prevalent in that area. We may also get some funding to replace the windows and entrance door at the Depot. The windows and the entrance door are original to the building which was built in the early 1900's. New windows and doors will match the existing features but will be much more energy efficient. This will be a big improvement not only to the efficiency of the building but to its appearance as well. The Friends had replaced the other entrance door on the west side a few years ago and that will stay as is.

I want to extend my appreciation to all our volunteers who helped with the spring cleaning and the folks that help in the visitor center in the summer. Thanks so much for what you do for the trails!

President's Report

I hope that you all had a nice winter and hopefully the summer will go well for you also. Thank you for your continued support of the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills Recreation Area.

We had a successful ski season that included the annual Candlelight Ski. The weather cooperated, if you are a winter outdoor enthusiast, as temperatures were reasonable with light winds. Volunteers greeted over 400 visitors to the trail that evening who enjoyed skiing, snowshoes and walking on the candlelit trails, ending their night with a cup of hot chocolate provided by Conagra. Thanks go to all who help make this event a success.

The new snowmobile was everything we had hoped for and allowed us to groom the Red Cedar State Trail more frequently while being a much safer option for the groomers. We continue to groom Menomonie to Irvington with two classic tracks and a narrower skating lane as over 90% of the skiers on that part of the trail classic ski. From Irvington to Downsville, we groom with one classic track with a much wider skating lane. Next ski season the plan will be that we also roll and pack from Downsville to Hwy Y to allow skiing, snowshoeing, hiking, and skijoring on that stretch.

Hoffman Hills got a bit of a late start due to the storm in December coinciding with the breakdown of our gator. Thanks to Calvin and the DNR for repairing the gator and a big thanks to Dave Challe for leading the cleanup efforts from the storm. Conditions were great once we got up and running, again thanks to Dave for all of his work.

The annual National Trails Day event is scheduled for 10:00 to noon on Saturday June 3rd and will include crafts, a reptile exhibit, free fishing, etc., so we hope you can attend. If the weather does not cooperate, we will be holding the event at the Menomonie Public Library and we will inform you of that on our various social media options.

Looking forward to our summer plans, a major project for us is the repair of the gazebo located at Trailhead with a cost of \$4,500. We have received a matching grant for 50% of the project costs and with your support the Friends will cover the other 50%. As noted in other sections in the newsletter, the Depot will be staffed throughout the summer to help visitors enjoy the trail and get information on our community. Finally, we hope to offer a program on foraging this fall and we will keep you updated on that.

We continue to do what we can to support our wonderful properties, making them as user friendly as we can. Again, thank you for your support and have a great summer.
